

EARLY CABELL FAMILY GRAVEYARDS

Montevideo (Repton)

Joseph Cabell, Jr. (1762-1831) built Repton in 1785 in Buckingham County. William H. Cabell changed the name to Montevideo when he bought the property in 1809.

Although some believe Joseph is buried at Montevideo (Repton), there is no proof.

Joseph's first wife, Pocahontas Rebecca Bolling, died in 1803 and after her death, Joseph moved to Kentucky (in 1811) where he died.

There is a marker for Joseph at Oakwood Cemetery in Charlottesville, VA which says he was moved from Zion Hill/Yellow Gravel to Oakwood in 1946 by his descendants.

There is a memorial stone to Pocahontas Rebecca Bolling Cabell (1765-1803) at her family's home, Chellowe in Buckingham County, where she died while visiting her parents.
