Located in Amherst County near Waugh's Ferry.

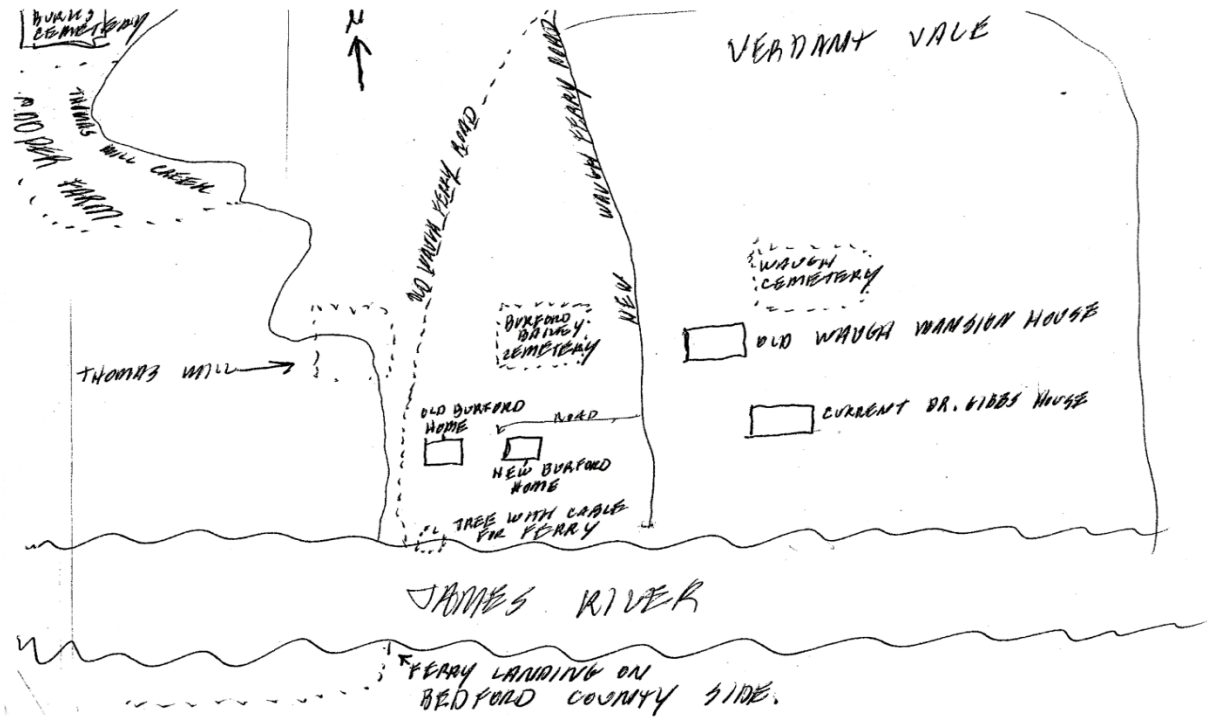
Supposedly Isabella McCulloch Waugh was buried in the graveyard on the property but the location is unknown; however, the Waugh graveyard remains.
